
Our History

Founded in 2006, Asheville on Bikes began as a group of 25 costumed cyclists who won a cash prize in Asheville's holiday parade. That prize became the nest egg for Asheville on Bikes' initial advocacy efforts, including community rides, bike corrals, and many, many emails to city and county staff. 15 years later, Asheville on Bikes has become synonymous with bicycle advocacy in Western North Carolina. Our efforts to improve Asheville's bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure, encourage more people to ride bicycles for recreation and transportation, and make Asheville a safe, easy, and enjoyable city to ride a bike are succeeding, thanks to the support and hard work of our members and sponsors.

YOUTH CYCLING PROGRAMS

Let's Empower Kids to Ride with Confidence

Bike Club has three sessions throughout the year. In the Spring and Fall, Bike Club is hosted at Asheville Middle School in partnership with In Real Life, the middle schools afterschool program. In the Summer, AoB coordinates with Youth Transformed for Life, a local non-profit working in Asheville and Buncombe County with youth who are disadvantaged, assisting them to reach their personal, educational, and professional goals.

AoB coordinates with a variety of community partners to provide youth cycling experiences designed to improve access to cycling to middle school aged students. Bike Club students learn how to ride their city with knowledge, skills, and joy. Students are paired with a trained coaching team and are provided with quality bicycles, helmets, and signature vests.

The Bike Club curriculum runs six to eight weeks. In that time, students learn how to wear safety gear, operate and maintain their equipment, and navigate traffic, greenways, and trails on a bike. We build in plenty of time and activities that allow students to safely practice navigating on two wheels. By the end of the program, they have real experience using a bicycle for transportation and recreation.


Let's Help Bike Commuters Get There Safely

CycleSmart courses, taught by League of American Bicyclists certified instructors in partnership with the Blue Ride Bicycle Club, help teens and adults learn how to ride their bikes safely and efficiently in an urban setting, so they can shop, work, and play without a car (or the hassle of finding a parking space).

Bicycle Ticket Diversion with CycleSmart

AoB partners with the Buncombe County District Attorney's office to offer the Bicycle Ticket Diversion Program, the first of its kind in NC! Commuters charged with a traffic violation while riding their bike can have their ticket and fines dismissed upon successful completion of the 3-hour CycleSmart class. This program is instrumental in our efforts to reduce economic barriers to bicycling and make it an accessible form of transportation for all income levels.





RIDEWITHGPS ROUTE LIBRARY

Bike riders can access community ride routes on the AoB RideWithGPS account. Bike riders can preview before an AoB event or download turn-by-turn directions to find new routes to ride on their own. Each route averages 1,500 annual views. Debuted in 2019, this program helps Asheville bike riders identify safe, pre-ridden routes based on their skill level and even whether they have kids.

Get There AVL

Every election cycle, Asheville on Bikes hosts Get There AVL, a public candidate forum focusing on Asheville transportation systems and issues. Our forums allow candidates to share their perspective on transportation issues in Asheville, and citizens have the opportunity to talk with each of the candidates in a relaxed, town hall setting. Our forums are well attended by both candidates and citizens.


We also survey general election candidates, asking for their thoughts on multi-modal transportation in Asheville, and publish their answers on our website.

Asheville Unpaved

Asheville Unpaved is a community-supported initiative, led by Asheville on Bikes, Pisgah Area SORBA, and Connect Buncombe, dedicated to building a network of multi-use natural surface trails that will help Asheville-area residents and visitors connect with one another, their natural environment, and their city.

Goal #1

We're helping to make public spaces more accessible, safe, and functional for all users.

This is a big goal, but we are achieving it with the help of our community.

Goal #2

We're making the case for the economic impacts of active transportation. We want to live in a city thriving with opportunities for all.

Goal #3

We're making bicycling more accessible to all. Starting with our youth after-school programs, we're taking strides to make everyone feel welcome and represented at AoB.

Let's Reimagine Our Public Spaces


AVL Unpaved Alliance led by AoB is dedicated to building three pilot natural surface trail systems to support better connections into the City's natural environments for Asheville-area residents and its visitors in 2024. Users will be able to access this unpaved trail system via greenway, sidewalks, bike lanes, transit, and trailheads, providing "front door" access to trails. Let's Build Safer Roads

Our members & supporters make an impact

In a city survey, more than 59% of citizens favored a Merrimon Avenue road diet to convert the dangerous North Asheville corridor from 4 lanes to 3, maintain 5-foot extended sidewalks, and create 5-foot bicycle lanes. Our city council approved the measure in May of 2022. This is just one example of how the efforts of our members, sponsors, and business partners are helping us make real changes on the ground and in the community.

WE SPEAK UP AND LOBBY DIRECTLY TO STATE & LOCAL ELECTED OFFICIALS

Advocacy means speaking up and asking for other people to take specific actions. In 2019, in just our published positions, we published 20 times about regional or local transportation issues. This includes our candidate

questionnaires, calls to public comment, and robust support for establishing COVID-safe streets and Circulator. We've spoken to Asheville City Council, we've spoken to the Multi-Modal Transportation Commission, we've spoken to the French Broad River MPO, we've spoken to local groups, we've called, we've emailed, and we've licked stamps and mailed letters to the governor. We've been to Raleigh and we've been to Washington—as lobbyists.

We evaluate each project like we see it, good or bad, and we are committed to seeing Asheville become the safest place in NC to ride a bike. Our work has been recognized by the League of American Bicyclists, who named AoB as the "Bicycle Advocacy Organization of the Year" in 2020.





Participant Ages


25-34 - 14%



BICYCLE FILM FESTIVAL \$2,000

Bicycle Film Festival is an international phenomenon produced by Brendt Barbur, Founding Festival Director. Barbur was compelled to start the Bicycle Film Festival after he was hit by a bus while riding his bike in New York City. He insisted on turning his negative experience into a positive one.

In 2001 Barbur started the Bicycle Film Festival as a platform to celebrate the bicycle through music, art and, of course, film.

The Bicycle Film Festival has been a major catalyst for the bike movement, one of the most powerful and culturally relevant forces of the last decade.

The BFF has held events in over 100 cities worldwide to an accumulated audience of over 1 million people.

The BFF offers both a streaming and in person showing. In 2023, Rabbit Rabbit hosted the BFF.

The bike valets are more than just bicycle parking. They serve as a bicycle social hub where people gather and socialize before the main event.

Bicycle valets can be set up in a variety of locations. We can park 200 bicycles in the same space that's allocated for 10 cars. Bike valets maximize parking at events.

For each event AoB creates a route via AoB's Ride With GPS library to the event or venue so that participants can select a preferred route.
